Purpose of Annual Action Plan: The Annual Action Plan presents a detailed strategy for the use of CDBG, HOME, ADDI, ESG, HOPWA and Continuum of Care Supportive Housing Program competitive grant funds expected to be received by the County during Local Fiscal Year 2008 to implement eligible activities in achieving second year objectives of the County's *Consolidated Plan: FY 2006 – FY 2010*. The Annual Action Plan also includes proposed amendments to previous Action Plans. In addition, the Annual Action Plan includes Anne Arundel County's definition of *affordable rents*, which applies to the CDBG program.

Public Comments on Annual Action Plan: Copies of the Annual Action Plan: LFY 2008 will be on file at the office of Arundel Community Development Services, Inc., the Office of Community and Constituent Services and Anne Arundel County Public Libraries on April 28, 2007. Oral and written comments received by or before 12:00 noon on May 28, 2007 will be considered and changes made if such changes are deemed appropriate prior to submitting the final plan to HUD on or about June 1, 2007. A summary of all comments, with reasons provided for any comments not incorporated, will be included in the Annual Action Plan submitted to HUD.
